Claire and I met in 1995 on a phone call where she was helping me with the abuse, that I had in my life at that time. For ten years you see, I had been calling the domestic violence and sexual assault hotline, and I would not give them my name. The abuse in my life had gotten worse, and that day I gave the agency my name and they said a counselor would be calling me. I remember where I was at, when I got that call from Claire. I was at work and I went into a work library to talk to her. When the call was over, she said I am putting my arms through the phone and giving you a hug. I felt that hug and later, I met her at the office, and I started counseling and women support group. After that period, Claire and I became fast friends and she became a mentor to me. I attended her women support group for over ten years learning all I could about domestic violence and sexual assault. 

THE REAUTHORIZATION OF THE VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN ACT IS SCHEDULED FOR A VOTE THIS WEEK IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. SAFE-T NEEDS YOUR HELP! MEMBERS OF CONGRESS NEED TO HEAR FROM YOU THAT YOU WANT THEM TO SUPPORT VAWA. THE NEW UPDATED VERSION OF VAWA MAINTAINS MANY OF ITS KEY COMPONENTS BUT ALSO EXPANDS IN IMPORTANT AREAS. H.R. 1620, THE VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN REAUTHORIZATION ACT OF 2021, WOULD:

- INCREASE PREVENTION;
- INVEST IN COMMUNITIES OF COLOR
- END IMPUNITY FOR VIOLENCE AGAINST NATIVE WOMEN BY NON-NATIVE PERPETRATORS ON TRIBAL LANDS;
- IMPROVE ACCESS TO HOUSING FOR VICTIMS AND SURVIVORS;
- PROTECT VICTIMS OF DATING VIOLENCE FROM FIREARM HOMICIDE;
- HELP SURVIVORS GAIN AND MAINTAIN ECONOMIC INDEPENDENCE;
- IMPROVE THE HEALTHCARE SYSTEM'S RESPONSE TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND SEXUAL ASSAULT, DATING VIOLENCE, AND STALKING.
